Reference is made to our receipt of your application, with enclosures including fingerprints and \$18 fee, requesting a search of the FBI's Criminal Justice Information Services Division Criminal File for any record pertaining to you.

Pursuant to U.S. Department of Justice Order 556-73, your fingerprints were searched through our Criminal File, and a record was located. However, the FBI does not honor requests for documents made by individuals who are currently fugitives from justice. A check of the Wanted Person File of the National Crime Information Center disclosed an active warrant for your arrest. This warrant was issued on April 1, 2011, by the El Paso County Sheriff's Office for "Failure to Appear." This warrant is still outstanding. In *Doyle v. United States Department of Justice* 494 F. Supp. 842 (1980), the court ruled that one who has removed himself/herself from the jurisdiction of the courts has no claim upon them. In view of this, until you are returned to the jurisdiction of a court within the United States or otherwise resolve the outstanding warrant previously described, this Division will not furnish your FBI identification record to you.
