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MORNING SESSION, FRIDAY, JUNE 8, 1990

(The Court was in session, and the following proceedings were had, to wit:)

THE COURT: We're back on the record with Wilfred.

Make your appearances for the record, please.

MS. EDINBURG: Good morning, Elaine Edinburg, attorney of record for the Petitioner. Petitioner is not present, this morning.

MR. WILFRED: Good morning, Your Honor. I'm Harmon Wilfred.

THE COURT: I have several matters to take care of this morning. The very first thing I want to take up, Mr. Wilfred, have you decided you wish to testify in this matter?

MR. WILFRED: No, Your Honor, I have not.

THE COURT: Have you not been told by anyone that it's inappropriate to testify by whoever talks to you?

MR. WILFRED: I don't understand, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Well, you apparently have some letters from Jesus that told you not to talk to me, and I would like to know whether you communicated with him again?

MR. WILFRED: Your Honor, I'm dealing from my conscience, and as far as my conscience is concerned with respect to my right as I've already stated, I really believe it's not appropriate for me to testify.

THE COURT: You understand why the Court is holding you in jail?

MR. WILFRED: Yes, Your Honor, I do, Your Honor.

THE COURT: You understand that I ordered you to testify, and you refused to obey my order?

MR. WILFRED: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: We're all clear on that?

MR. WILFRED: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. I believe there is somebody in court, Phyllis Lambert. Are you in court?

MS. LAMBERG: Yes.

THE COURT: Ms. Lambert, did you wish to address the Court on this matter?

MR. WILFRED: Your Honor, may I make a comment?

I do not wish Phyllis Lambert to be heard on my behalf or address the Court on my behalf. I believe that I have the right to say that. I think I do. I'm not an attorney.

I would like to think that I do.

THE COURT: Well, Ms. Lambert, based on the evidence that I've had before me, there are certain documents that were entered into evidence which were written by you or someone that you speak to. Given the testimony of the fearfulness of various parties, I'm very concerned about your emotional and mental health. Would you be willing to submit to a screening, to have your mental

health looked at to see whether or not you need to be hospitalized?

MR. WILFRED: Your Honor, I have no problem with that.

THE COURT: All right. I'm going to order a mental health screening pursuant to a possible hold and treat, but if you're willing to do that yourself, that would be very good.

MR. WILFRED: Oh, yes.

THE COURT: Let's see if we can get a psychiatrist to do that. I would like to have available to the psychiatrist certain pieces of evidence. I don't know how we do that with the Sheriff. We'll try to work that out. We will remand you back to jail for a mental health screening pursuant to the mental health laws, and after that's over, I will have you back in court to determine whether I'm going to hold you on the contempt or whether you'll need to be seen by a hospital, and unfortunately, this is Friday. If we find out by 5 o'clock this afternoon, I will have you back in court.

MR. WILFRED: Thank you, Your Honor.

THE COURT: That's all.

(Whereupon, the Court adjourned this matter at 9:57 a.m.)
