MORNING SESSION, MONDAY, JUNE 11, 1990

(The Court was in session, and the following proceedings were had, to wit:)

THE COURT: Okay. We're going to call the Wilfred matter.

MR. WILFRED: Should I come down, Your Honor?

THE COURT: Please. Mr. Wilfred, you were found to be in contempt of Court for refusing to testify last week.

Is that what you remember?

MR. WILFRED: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: I've been holding you in jail pending several things. The first thing was, you were held in jail because you could cure the contempt, and the way to cure the contempt would be to testify.

MR. WILFRED: I understand that, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Have you changed your mind?

MR. WIFLRED: No, Your Honor. My position has not changed. I still feel my rights have been violated for due process and for religious freedom, so I could not, with good conscience, testify, Your Honor.

THE COURT: That trial is now over.

MR. WILFRED: I understand.

THE COURT: Had you changed your mind and wanted to testify, we would have reopened that, because the Court did retain jurisdiction on that.

]]

MR. WILFRED: I understand that, Your Honor.

THE COURT: So, there's no more reason for me to hold you in jail on contempt for what we call remedial purposes. In other words, you hold the key to the courthouse -- to the jail. You can leave the jail any time you want as long as you're willing to testify. I think you understand that.

MR. WILFRED: I do understand that, Your Honor.

THE COURT: However, there's something called punitive contempt which means because the Court is offended by your behavior, then you are subject to a jail sentence of a specific time, and the Court has determined that it's appropriate to hold you in jail for another 24 hours, and you will be released tomorrow on the contempt. This last 24 hours is a punitive contempt. Do you understand that is punitive sanctions?

MR. WILFRED: I understand that.

THE COURT: Now, you were also held for the Court to have a psychiatrist look at you for purposes of possible hold and treat, and I udnerstand that Dr. Martinez was with you yesterday?

MR. WIFLRED: Yes, he was.

THE COURT: And that was something that you voluntarily did subjecting yourself to that.

MR. WILFRED: Yes, Your Honor, I did.

THE COURT: The Doctor has told me that you don't, although he feels you have some serious problems, you don't meet the criteria under the mental health statute, and, therefore, you are going to be released on that.

So, it's the Court's order that you will be released after serving a punitive sentence of 24 hours.

MR. WIFLRED: Okay, Your Honor.

THE COURT: You may be released tomorrow morning about 8:30.

THE DEPUTY: Okay.

THE COURT: I will have Joanne do a mittimus.

Mr. Wilfred, you recall that one of the parts of the

permanent orders that I entered last week was a permanent

restraining order.

MR. WILFRED: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: And that was a restraining order provided that you shall not go near your ex-wife, your child or any of the witnesses nor shall you harass them in any way.

MR. WIFLRED: I understand, Your Honor.

THE COURT: And that permanent restraining order has to have a final date, and my clerk will have to tell the other side, because I did not give a date on that restraining order. It will end on June 30, 2000, unless continued by this Court or any other Court. All right.

That's all. MR. WILFRED: Thank you, Your Honor. (Whereupon, the Court adjourned this matter at 10:02 a.m.)
